- No special application deadlines





Main priorities

Primarily co-operation activities within Denmark

- Developing growth and creating new jobs in rural areas
- 2. Activities and investments that improve framework conditiones supporting development and settlement in the rural areas.





Selection criteria

LAGs select projects that are in line with their local development strategy

Funding

- Funding comes from the budget that LAGs have been allocated each year, and therefore competes with all other projects
- No specific central budget line





Constraints in Denmark

- Own LAG funding
- Reduction of LAG funds from 2017
